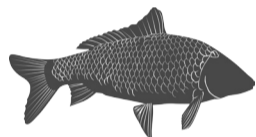

Success of the Bourke to Brewarrina Demonstration Reach has come from a partnership between the Western Catchment Management Authority, NSW Department of Primary Industries, the Murray-Darling Basin Authority, Bourke and Brewarrina Shire Councils, local fishing clubs, local landholders and the local Aboriginal community.



Over 8500 native plants planted



442 snags installed at 11 sites



100km of weed control



60km of river frontage fenced



9 offshore stock watering points installed



3 eroded gullies restored



Many field days and community events



804 recreational anglers participating in Carp removal
